Peoples Republic of Bangladesh

Bangladesh, which emerged as an independent nation in 1971, is a developing economy of South Asia. With a population of 160 million, the country's basic economic policy is aimed at achieving high and steady growth, reduce wide spread poverty and sustain macroeconomic stability. The economy is in transition from a public sector dominated economy to a private sector led economy. International trade and foreign investment is considered to be vital in its endeavour to become a robust economy in South Asia. The ready-made garments (woven and knitwear) industry is responsible for nearly 78% of the country's export revenues. Other sectors such as frozen food, leather, ceramics, home textile, fledgling toy industry, pharmaceuticals, ICT, ITES (Information Technology Enabling Service) and ship building are growing and contributing positively to Bangladesh's economy. The GDP was 8.1% in 2018.

Major Industries in Bangladesh

Ready made garments (woven and knitwear); textiles; chemical; sugar; fertiliser; cement; pharmaceutical; frozen food; jute goods; leather; waste water treatment; energy production including renewable and ship building.

Major Imports into Bangladesh

Machinery and equipment; chemicals; iron and steel; yarn; textiles; food grain and other foodstuffs; crude petroleum and petroleum products; plastic and rubber articles.

Major Imports into Bangladesh from the UK

Power generation and industrial machinery & equipment; scrap metal; professional and scientific equipment; textile fibres; medical and pharmaceutical products; dyeing; tanning and colouring materials; electrical machinery; apparatus and appliances; chemical; materials and products; office machinery.

Trade Mission

The trade mission will depart the UK on Friday 15th November arriving in Dhaka in the early hours of Saturday 16th November.

The delegation will be based in Dhaka but visits to Chittagong and Sylhet will be included for those wanting to visit these cities.

The British High Commission, Dhaka & Bangladesh High Commission, London, will be providing support in this Mission.

Where possible group meetings will be arranged with a number of the Bangladeshi Ministries and Chambers of Commerce. A networking reception will be organised and a 'Meet the Mission' half day programme will also be set. In addition delegates will be accompanied during the mission by ethnic entrepreneurs with an interest in joint venture projects.

The delegation will depart Dhaka on Friday 22nd November arriving back in the UK on Saturday 23rd November.
